Who belongs in this process?

Children who are:

- At least 7 years old seeking Baptism in the Catholic Church.
- At least 7 years old, Baptized in another Christian faith tradition, and now wish to become Roman Catholic.
- At least 9 years old, Baptized Roman Catholic, but have never been catechized and have not yet received First Holy Communion.

This process prepares the children for the Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church and is adapted to instruct children of all ages.
