

PUBLIC FAST FOR A JUST AND COMPASSIONATE

BUDGET This year, Holy Week coincides with the last week of the scheduled legislative session in Olympia. One of the core principles of Catholic Social Teaching is that economic decisions must be judged in light of their effect on the poor. The budget debates at the state and federal level threaten to cut services to our most vulnerable brothers and sisters. During Holy Week, we have an opportunity to combine our Lenten practices of prayer and fasting with a particular focus on seeking a budget that reflects justice. 
