# *Mental Health Ministry*

St. James Cathedral has a new ministry! The Parish Mental Health Ministry is an exciting new program, believed to be the first of its kind in the United States. Its purpose is to provide preventative and palliative mental health care to parishioners of St. James Cathedral, and as resources are available, the residents of Seattle's First Hill neighborhood, particularly the elderly and economically challenged. This ministry is made possible from new sources of funds including grants from outside the parish.

We have hired Beth Rose, RN to be Parish Mental Health Nurse and to direct the program. Beth holds both Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Nursing and is completing a Master's in Theology at Marylhurst University.

Beth will make home visits to persons who either have requested services or who have been referred by designated St. James Cathedral staff. The intent of the program is for the nurse to provide effective intervention in the parish community at the earliest possible

stage of mental illness, offer supportive care, and recommend appropriate actions and referrals as needed.

She will also provide training and supervision of lay volunteers to share in this work. In addition to accompanying the nurse on house calls, some of the shared work will include making follow up telephone wellness checks to clients.

The ministry will include a regular program of education in the parish to assist the parish as a whole in its capacity to provide a solid spiritual foundation for mental and emotional well being. *A special blessing of this new ministry will take place Monday, May 16 at the 5:30pm Mass.*

We are actively recruiting for volunteers to be part of this journey. For information call Beth Rose, Parish Mental Health Nurse, 206-382-4269. Sunday, May 29 is information day! Be sure to stop by our information table at coffee hour.

May 15 is the Feast Day of St. Dymphna - patron saint of people living with mental illness. May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Since all people are created in the image of God, their dignity and worth cannot be diminished by any condition, including mental illness. We pray that the darkness of stigma, labels, exclusion and marginalization might be dispelled by the light of greater understanding, acceptance and respect for the dignity of every person.

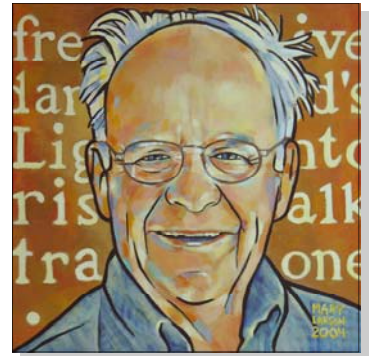
