## MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY SURVEY - REPORT

A one-page survey about mental health issues was distributed in the parish bulletins on October 29-30, 2011 and posted on the parish webpage. There were 250 individual respondents. ### Experience With Mental Health Issues (now or at any time in the past)

- Over 84% of all respondents report having had experience with one or more of the mental health issues listed, with an average of 3.5 issues per respondent.
- The frequency of reported issues is displayed in the table ->

- Note that respondents could check any issue they had experience with; most checked more than two.

### Response to Mental Health Issues

A majority of those responding to the survey indicated that they know where and how to get help with a mental health issue when they need it (69%) with many of the rest (16%) admitting they are not sure. Parishioners were asked about a number of possible services that the mental health ministry might provide. The table below displays the number of respondents who indicated an interest in each of the options.

## Advent Liturgies

To mark this holy season of longing and waiting, we change some of our usual liturgical practices. The processional path of the ministers into the cathedral is modified and the altar is decorated more simply. During the liturgies, a greater role is given to silence, to the chanting of psalms, and to the ringing of bells. In accordance with a very ancient tradition in the church, the use of the organ is reduced during Advent.

The Advent wreath is a devotion we have adopted from the Lutheran tradition. As in past years, the wreath is placed at the foot of the statue of Our Lady in the north transept. ## Ecumenical Prayer with Music from Taizé

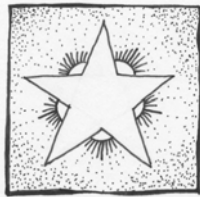
