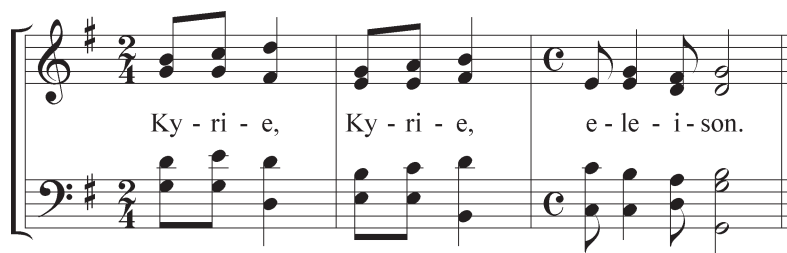

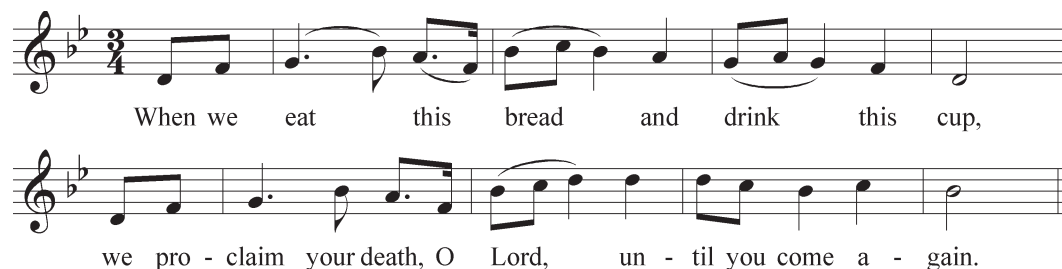

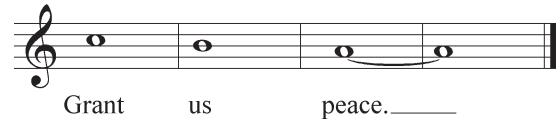

This talk centers on *Gaudium et Spes*, the Constitution of the Second Vatican Council on the Church in the Modern World. It will look at some of the factors that led the council to write this document, some of the underlying issues, the main themes of the document, and how it serves as the end point to a theological arc in the teachings of the Second Vatican Council

Father Michael Raschko Fr. Michael Raschko is a priest of the Archdiocese of Seattle. He was ordained by Archbishop Hunthausen in 1975 after finishing his studies at St. Edwards and St. Thomas Seminaries. He is the Bertch Professor of Catholic Systematic Theology in the School of Theology and Ministry of Seattle University, where many of the lay ministers of our Archdiocese have received their education and training. On weekends he preaches and celebrates the Eucharist at Holy Rosary Parish in West Seattle. He holds a Ph.D. in Systematic Theology from the University of Chicago where he studied with such outstanding Catholic scholars as David Tracy, Ann Carr, and Bernard McGinn..



Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals DACA

To qualify for DACA, you must:

- ♦ Have been younger than 31 on June 15, 2012;
- ♦ Have arrived in the U.S. before the age of 16;
- ♦ Have lived in the U.S., continuously, since June 15, 2007;
- ♦ Have entered without inspection before June 15, 2012 or your unlawful immigration status expired as of June 15, 2012;
- ♦ Be currently enrolled in school, have a high school diploma/GED, or have been honorably discharged from the U.S. Armed Forces or Coast Guard; and
- ♦ Not have been convicted of a felony, a significant misdemeanor, or more than two other misdemeanors, and do not otherwise pose a national security or public safety threat.

What is DACA? It's a federal program that offers DREAMers a work permit and a two-year deferment from deportation proceedings. DREAMers are undocumented immigrants, younger than 31, who were brought to the U.S. as children. In King County there are about 14,000 DREAMers eligible for DACA.



St. James ESL can help you apply for DACA.

Our services include:

- Screening for DACA and other immigration relief options, with referrals to other legal agencies, if necessary
- Individual in-person consultation
- DACA request preparation
- Application review by a Board of Immigration Appeals accredited representative

There is \$150 fee to cover a portion of the costs of service.

BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE
