



Year of Faith Action Steps

FOR FAMILIES:

FOR YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS:

Share your faith by building peace within yourself, within your family and in your relationships with friends. Build peace by affirming and encouraging those around you rather than criticizing them, or giving in to gossip or ridicule.

FOR EVERYONE:

Take time to pray and reflect on the Beatitudes found in Matthew 5:1-12. Begin building peace by forgiving yourself. Extend forgiveness to those who have hurt you. Reflect on ways you hold grudges, criticize yourself or others, seek out or spread gossip. Disarm the heart and work on bringing peace to all areas of your life.
