This is "Annual Catholic Appeal" season in the Archdiocese of Seattle. The Appeal is all about being Catholic: it gives us the opportunity to support the work of the wider church in Western Washington—the work of Catholic Community Services, the education of seminarians, support of retired priests and women religious, and so much more.

The good news is that we have met our Archdiocesan goal of \$318,000 and at this point **every dollar that comes in will come right back to the parish in the form of a rebate. And we need the rebate!** This year, it will help support our new Youth Ministry and Family Ministry programs.






