The ESL Program has a new name!

For over 38 years, we have helped adult, low-income refugees and immigrants to learn English; and we will continue to do that. After much discussion, we choose our new name, "St. James Immigrant Assistance", to reflect all we do.

We help people to:

- ❖ Learn English
- ❖ Prepare for and apply to become U.S. citizens
- ❖ Apply for deferred action for childhood arrivals
- ❖ Learn basic civics, including rights and responsibilities
- ❖ Make connections with others from both within and across cultures
- ❖ Find out about and access local public and social services

Tatiana, and her friend Ilyaeva, became U.S. citizens after studying with their tutor.



Tatiana is very happy to be a citizen and feels more “secure” and “safe.”

She says becoming a U.S. citizen has been good for her health since she feels less stress, and attributes her improved blood pressure to this.

Tatiana is now interested in learning how to vote. She feels more confident talking with sales clerks, and making appointments. She even called the cable company concerning a mistake on her bill.

A group of elder immigrants in Seatac **learned how to take the bus and the Sounder train**, and signed up for ORCA cards. Afterwards, they took the bus to downtown Seattle for a day of shopping and visiting attractions such as the aquarium. This was the first time they they did anything like this on their own.



A former nurse from Russia wanted to learn English so she could talk with the doctor about her husband’s glaucoma. She not only studied English; her tutor also **helped her understand patients’ rights** and what nurses, doctors, and other health care staff would expect from her.



Wuroud is a blind mother of two who fled Baghdad with her family during the Iraq War. Before studying with St. James ESL, she studied on her own and attended an English conversation class at the Auburn Library. After only six months of tutoring here, Wuroud’s English had improved enough that she **enrolled at Highline Community College**.
