
Dear Friends,

At their best, these Advent days are filled with joy and expectation – with what one contemporary spiritual writer likes to call “the holy longing.” But I know they can also be filled to overflowing with big demands on our time, our attention, our pocketbooks, and even our peace of mind. That’s true for me and I suspect it’s true for you. In the midst of it all, however, I do hope that you are finding time to do some quiet reflecting on what it is we are waiting for – who it is we are waiting for in these Advent days. Most of us don’t have the luxury of putting life on hold during Advent. We’re not contemplative monks, after all! But each of us can find ways to be quietly prayerful: to stop and breathe and reflect and give thanks. Christmas celebrates the God who wanted there to be no distance whatever between creator and creature, the God who bridged that distance in a moment in time by becoming one of us. May we, during these Advent days, take time to bask in the wonder of what it all means!

I want to take this opportunity to express my thanks to all of you who have renewed your Sacrificial Giving commitment for the coming year. With some very real hesitation, I asked you to consider increasing your gift this year in order to make it possible for us to fund some new and very exciting ministries. Not only did you respond positively to my request, many of you even went beyond what I asked. So, to all of you who have so generously stepped forward to support our parish, a huge word of thanks. And to those of you who have yet to make a commitment, well, there’s still time (and, yes, there’s a great need!). We are still \$390,000 short of where we hope to be, but I’m confident we can get there.

Over the years, many of you have asked us to increase the availability near the Cathedral of parking for disabled persons. I am sorry it has taken so long to make this happen, but happen it finally has! The city of Seattle acceded to our request to designate most of the west side of Terry Avenue behind the Cathedral as parking for the disabled. Our hope is that this will make it much easier for parishioners with disabilities to park close to the Cathedral seven days a week. If you know of people who have not been coming to the Cathedral because of the lack of designated parking for the disabled, you may wish to share with them the good word that some real improvement has been made. And yet another improvement should come fairly early in the new year: stop signs at the intersection of Terry Avenue and Columbia Street. I believe that corner has been an accident waiting to happen. The new stop signs and marked crosswalks should make things far safer for everyone.

May the remaining days of Advent bring peace and joy to all of us – and deepen within us a “holy longing” for the Christ who comes to us at Christmas, at the end of time, and who, even now, is “in our midst as one who serves!”

THE ST VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCES of St.

James thank cathedral parishioners for their generous donations last month. During November we made 46 home visits to our low income neighbors. Your contributions allowed us to help 29 individuals and families pay their rent and stay safely in their homes. In addition, we prevented 2 utility shut-offs, provided food for 38 families, beds and furniture for 16 households, clothes for 5 people, and transportation assistance for 2 individuals. Our priority is preventing homelessness. This makes your contributions go a long way. Helping our neighbors pay their rent is far cheaper than picking up the pieces after they lose their homes. Members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society follow Jesus through service to those in need. Bearing witness to Christ's compassionate and liberating love, we show our commitment through person-to-person contact, making our home visits in pairs. 

