

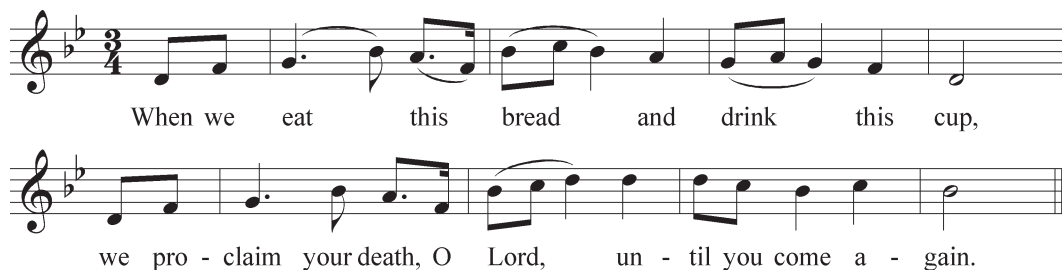

A Unique Gift

What could be a more personal, caring and meaningful gift than the gift of blood to someone in our community who has the need? Who needs blood?

It is very likely that someone you know at St. James has had a need for blood. People who need blood include those who have been in accidents or require surgery or chemotherapy. To meet the needs in our community, over 900 people must donate blood through the Puget Sound Blood Center every weekday.
