Journey of Faith

An Illustrated History of the Church in Western Washington

It's a story of saints and sinners; of Natives and newcomers, of missionaries, teachers, and builders, working together to build the church in western Washington.... It's a story of spirit and sacrifice for the glory of God.

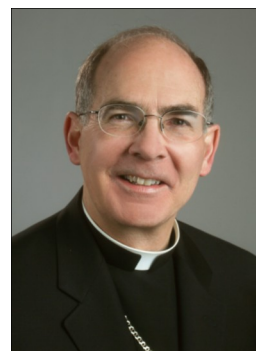
