- In the spaces on Terry Avenue reserved for loading and unloading of the parish vans.



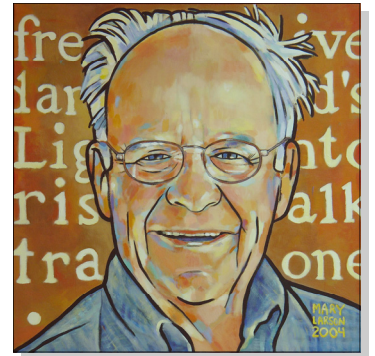

WINTER SHELTER



"Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or see you thirsty and give you drink? When did we welcome you or clothe you?" The King will answer them: "I assure you, as often as you did it for the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it for me." Matthew 25:37-40

The 2014 One Night Count found 3,123 people sleeping outdoors on the streets of King County. **St. James Cathedral partners with St. Martin de Porres Shelter to provide overflow sleeping space during the cold winter months.** St. Martin de Porres, a program of Catholic Community Services, has room for 212 homeless men. During the winter, St. Martin's is always full and has to turn away many people. From October through April, Friday night through Monday night, St. James provides a warm and safe place to sleep in Cathedral Hall for 10-14 men.

Nearly 100 parishioners are needed to volunteer at the Winter Shelter, now in its 23rd year. Please consider joining our shelter team as an **overnight host, breakfast cook, toiletries donation sorter, or substitute host.**

GoodNewsPeople

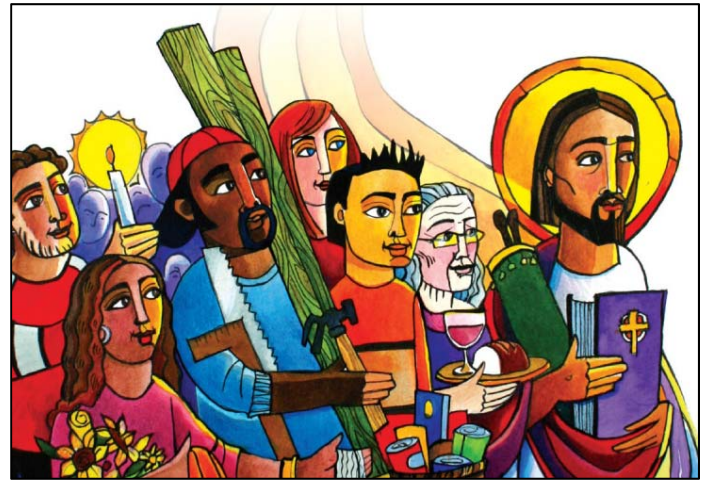
Faith, Hope, and Love in Action

GoodNewsPeople is a dynamic parish-wide program that offers a way to explore the call of the New Evangelization. Through an engaging small-group process of prayer, reflection, and action, GoodNewsPeople explores and deepens our call to discipleship. Each session includes prayer, reflection on Sacred Scripture, inspiring stories of “good news people,” focus on a virtue of the week, and woven through it all, opportunities for sharing in dialogue.

Meet other parishioners and experience a greater sense of purpose and belonging. Groups will be meeting at a variety of times and locations.

- ✓ 14 small group sessions with 2 seasons of 7 sessions each
