construction update #2

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 2015

PROJECT UPDATE

In the past month, work has begun in earnest on the exterior lighting of the Cathedral. During the week, workers can be seen laboring away at a height of over 160 feet!

This week workers have been installing electrical and computer control cabling to the top levels of the north tower. They have also been installing the steel beams on all four faces of the tower onto which the new light fixtures will be attached. These fixtures are on several levels and will provide illumination to the very top of the tower. When this work is completed, the crew will install similar fixtures on the South Tower.

The fences which have gone up around the Cathedral are there to keep passersby safe as workers install lighting fixtures on the Cathedral's towers. By law, we must clear a 60-foot radius when work is taking place above. For this reason, the west doors of the Cathedral are closed to the public while work is going on. This will avoid injury to anyone who might be below in the unlikely event that an item fall to the ground. For the same reason, we have enclosed *Sedes Sapientiae*, the beautiful statue of the Virgin and Child in the courtyard, in plywood for the duration of the project.

The project is on track to be virtually complete by the end of November, with the inauguration of the lighting to take place at the

beginning of the Year of Mercy, Tuesday, December 8.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

During the week, for your safety, while work is going on in the towers, there will be no access to the west plaza of the Cathedral or to the Archbishop Murphy Courtyard. Access to the Bookstore will be via the Music Office door. We will reopen these entrances on the weekends.

St. James Cathedral offers an opportunity to learn what the encyclical says, to engage with its vision, and to respond to the challenge it presents:

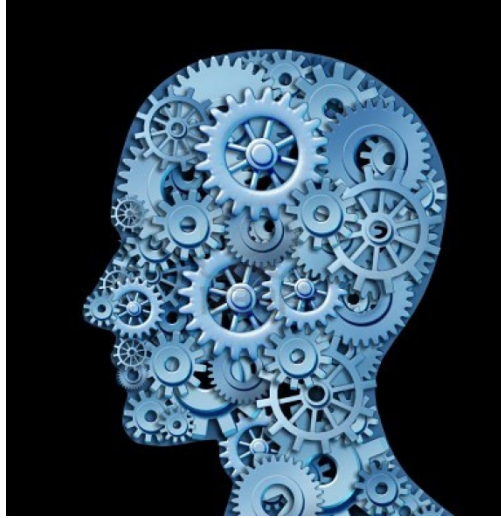
