



The North Korean people are facing one of the greatest challenges in the world today. Come hear the story of North Korean refugees – their 3,000 mile escape route, resettlement, empowerment, and how they are trying to change the way the world sees North Korea so they get the help they need.

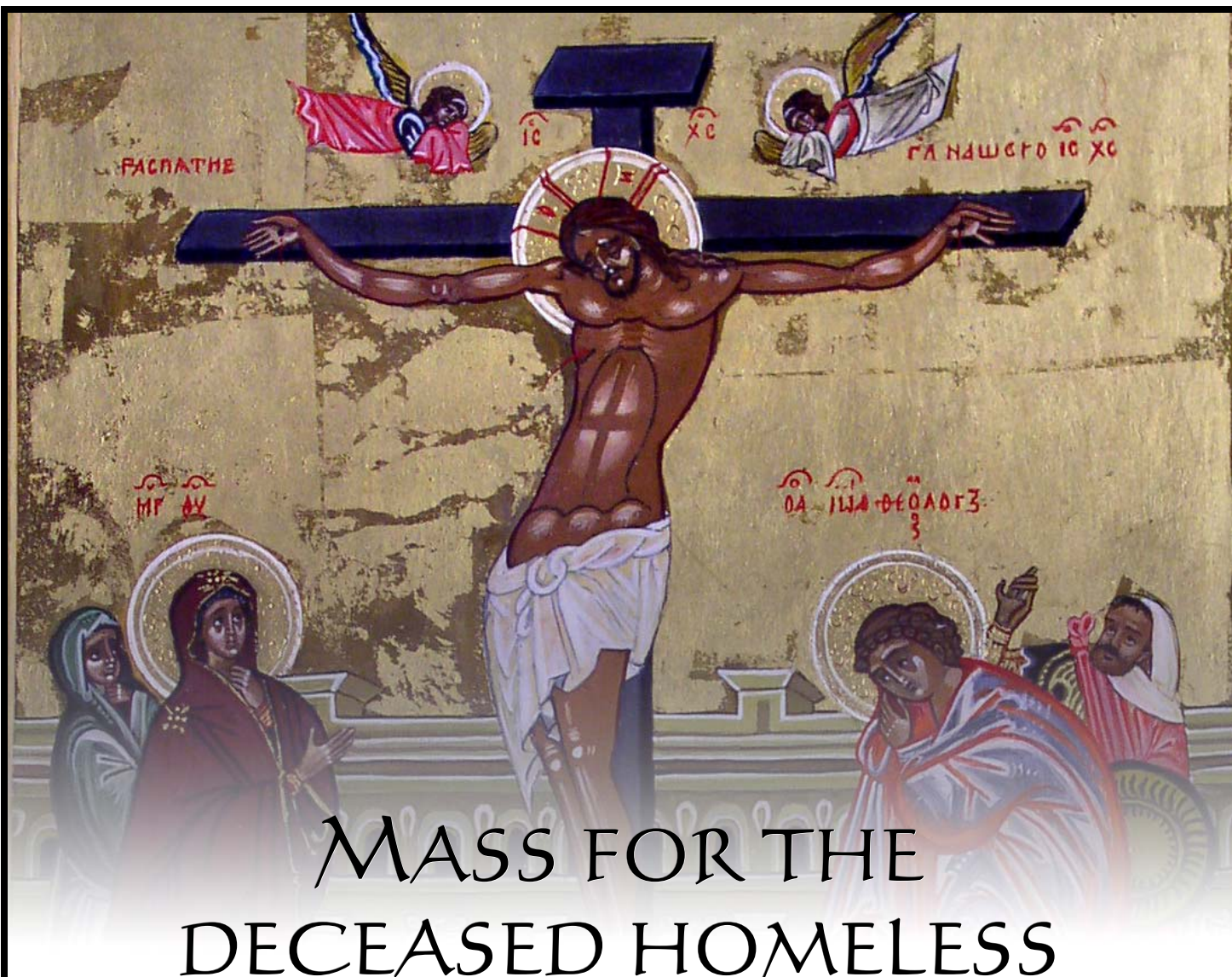
Sang Hoon never had a place to call his own in North Korea, often spending his nights in the homes of his friends and relatives. Sang Hoon had always been interested in other countries and hoped to work as a diplomat, but he was never able to follow his dream in North Korea. His desire to leave his home country grew day by day until he could take it no more and he found someone to help him escape. Once in China, he connected with the Liberty in North Korea network and made the journey to safety and freedom in South Korea. Now, Sang Hoon is one of the most passionate, ambitious people we have the privilege to work with. As soon as he resettled, he began taking classes to learn how to use the computer. Most people take one class at a time, but Sang Hoon doubled them up and was able to get four computer certificates in very little time. He also got a job at a research institute, and continues to learn more and strives to achieve his goals every day.
