




A Celebration for the Feast of Saint Nicholas

Sunday, December 6 7:30pm

SAINT NICHOLAS, whose feast day is celebrated December 6, was an actual priest who was born in modern-day Turkey. The Eastern Orthodox church calls him Saint Nicholas the Wonderworker, and he is a very popular patron saint in Greek and Russian churches. Very little is known about his actual life, but marvelous legends abound. Notably, he rescued three young women from prostitution by secretly throwing a dowry for each of them in at their window by night. On another occasion, he miraculously restored to life three young boys who had been killed and pickled in a barrel. During a sea-voyage his prayers rescued himself, passengers, and crew from the storm. Hence, he was noted for fasting and giving away his wealth to the poor, and he is the patron saint of children, barrel makers, sailors, and travelers.

On Sunday, December 6, at 7:30pm, these delightful stories will be colorfully brought to life when Cathedral resident ensemble Opus 7 presents **Benjamin Britten's** dramatic cantata, *Saint Nicolas*. This semi-staged performance will feature American tenor Brendan Tuohy in the virtuoso title role of the beloved saint.
