A guide to Sunday parking at the Cathedral

*We know that parking in this area is at a premium and we do our best to make it available to you.
In consideration of our neighbors, please note these important Do’s and Don’ts!*

PLEASE DO park:

- In the O’Dea High School lot.
- In the Cabrini Tower Garage on Marion Street across from O’Dea High School for the Saturday 5:30 pm Mass and all Sunday Masses. *The Cathedral pays for parking (and for official traffic officers from the Seattle Police Department) during these times, and you are encouraged to take advantage of it.*
Did you know that there is also parking underground at Cabrini Garage? Dozens of spots sit empty every weekend. Try it if you arrive late.
- In the P-1 parking lot under the Chancery building at 9th and Marion.
- In the Cherry and Terry Parking lot, *only* in spaces **1-22**.

Please DO NOT park:

- In any parking spot blocked with an orange cone.
- In the Cherry and Terry Parking lot, spaces 23-40 (the south side of the L shaped lot). *These are clearly marked with signs; we do appreciate your not parking there.*
- In the lot adjacent to the Envoy Apartments on 9th Avenue, directly across from the Cathedral.
- In the Blood Bank parking lot at the corner of Terry and Columbia.
- In the Frye Museum parking lots on Terry Avenue.
- In the parking places at the Pastoral Outreach Center, 907 Columbia Street.
- In the spaces on Terry Avenue reserved for loading and unloading of the parish vans.

St. James Cathedral has hosted guests from St. Martin de Porres Shelter during the winter months for 24 years. This allows the St. Martin's to expand its ministry to men 50-years and older experiencing homelessness. Our winter shelter season has come to a successful conclusion! Thank you to all who contributed to this endeavor—the volunteers, the hygiene product donors, and those who prayed for the guests and shelter. Here is a look at the shelter season by the numbers:

1,508	The number of bed-nights provided for our guests from St. Martin de Porres Shelter. Guests are provided with a late-night snack, hygiene products, and a safe and warm place to sleep.
1,508	The number of warm and nourishing breakfasts provided to our guests in the morning. Volunteers purchase all the ingredients and arrive at St. James Cathedral at 5:45am to prepare the meal.
82	The number of overnight hosts, breakfast hosts, hygiene kit organizers, and one fantastic scheduler who all volunteer their time to make this shelter possible.
3,042	A low-end estimate of the number of hours our volunteers contributed.
0	The number of nights cancelled thanks to heroic efforts by our volunteers who stepped up at the last minute to fill a shift.
