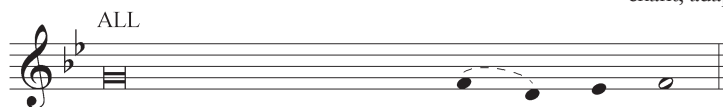

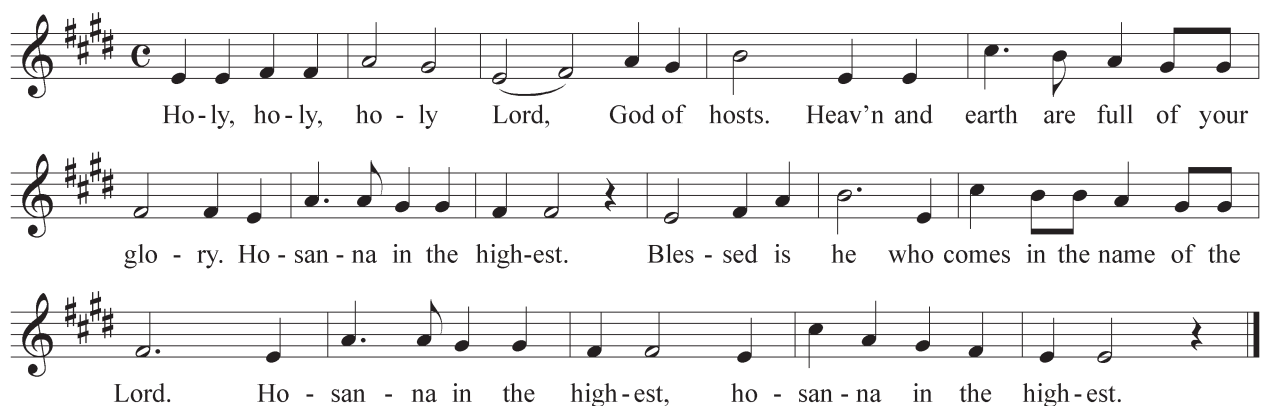

He applied for governmental assistance but was refused because one of his doctors incorrectly reported an important fact related to his application. With nowhere else to turn, he called the SVdP Helpline (206-767-6449). We visited and helped pay his rent so he would not lose housing while he continues to seek long-term governmental assistance. WHEEL IS A GRASSROOTS ORGANIZING EFFORT of homeless/formerly-homeless women, well-regarded in Seattle. For the past 16 years they've operated a loving, low-barrier, night-time women's shelter, which is currently seeking a new home. Starting August 1, St James will allow use of Cathedral Hall for WHEEL, so that 50-60 women, along with 2 WHEEL staff, may have a safe and secure place to sleep. WHEEL will only be here at night, and will not interrupt the daily life of the Cathedral. Because of the Cathedral's commitment to the Winter Shelter, WHEEL is actively pursuing a new and permanent host site and will stay only until late September. A guide to Sunday parking at the Cathedral

*We know that parking in this area is at a premium and we do our best to make it available to you.
In consideration of our neighbors, please note these important Do's and Don'ts!*

PLEASE DO park:

- In the O'Dea High School lot.
- In the Cabrini Tower Garage on Marion Street across from O'Dea High School for the Saturday 5:30 pm Mass and all Sunday Masses. *The Cathedral pays for parking (and for official traffic officers from the Seattle Police Department) during these times, and you are encouraged to take advantage of it.*
- *Did you know that there is also parking underground at Cabrini Garage? Dozens of spots sit empty every weekend. Try it if you arrive late.*
- In the P-1 parking lot under the Chancery building at 9th and Marion.
- In the Cherry and Terry Parking lot, **only** in spaces **1-22**.

Please DO NOT park:

- In any parking spot blocked with an orange cone.
- In the Cherry and Terry Parking lot, spaces 23-40 (the south side of the L shaped lot). *These are clearly marked with signs; we do appreciate your not parking there.*
- In the lot adjacent to the Envoy Apartments on 9th Avenue, directly across from the Cathedral.
- In the Blood Bank parking lot at the corner of Terry and Columbia.
- In the Frye Museum parking lots on Terry Avenue.
- In the parking places at the Pastoral Outreach Center, 907 Columbia Street.
- In the spaces on Terry Avenue reserved for loading and unloading of the parish vans.

St. James is the Cathedral Church for the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle. It is also a parish church for a large and vital community. Noted for its beautiful liturgies and its extensive outreach to the poor, the Cathedral also serves the city of Seattle as an important gathering place, a crossroads for learning, and a center for the arts.

Built in 1907, St. James Cathedral is an impressive Italian Renaissance-style building whose twin towers soar to a height of 167 feet. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first American citizen to be canonized, worshiped in the Cathedral in its early years. In 1994, a nationally acclaimed restoration and renovation completely renewed the beauty of this beloved Seattle landmark, transforming it into a dynamic space for the celebration of the Church's liturgy as well as for ecumenical, cultural, and civic events.

Artistic highlights of St. James include magnificent ceremonial bronze doors and tabernacle by German artist Ulrich Henn; an award-winning Shrine to the Blessed Virgin Mary; and a large collection of stained glass by renowned artists Charles Connick and Hans Gottfried von Stockhausen. The Cathedral Chapel is home to a remarkable 15th-century Renaissance altarpiece by Neri di Bicci.

St. James Cathedral is also a vibrant parish community of more than 2,400 households, coming from more than 180 ZIP codes around the entire Puget Sound region.



BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL

The Cathedral's Blessed Sacrament Chapel brings together old and new in a space that speaks to the Church's faith in Christ present among us in the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

The Chapel itself dates from 1994. A skylight allows natural light to stream into this space, creating a visual link with the Cathedral's altar. The transparent gates allow the tabernacle to be seen from all parts of the Cathedral, and also allow the Chapel to be closed during Mass. The gates can also be opened wide—for First Friday devotions and for Holy Thursday adoration, for example. The north gates incorporate a beautiful stained glass triptych by Charles Connick (dating from around 1917). These windows were originally placed in the East Apse of the Cathedral, and were moved here in 1994 to allow for the installation of larger windows by Hans Gottfried von Stockhausen. Inside the Chapel, a carving of the Last Supper, placed on the south wall, dates from 1907 and was originally part of the Cathedral's high altar. The sanctuary lamp, which hangs high on the wall just outside the Chapel, also dates from 1907.

The tabernacle itself is the work of Ulrich Henn. It suggests the story of the burning bush from Exodus – Moses' mysterious encounter with God at the bush which was on fire, but not consumed by the fire. It is the perfect image for this place of encounter with the living presence of Christ in our midst. An inscription in the floor near the altar reminds us: "the place where you stand is holy ground."

Facilitated by Ansebe Bicoff-Smit, a child, couple, and family psychotherapist, the group explores topics such as child development, emotional attachment, positive parenting, transitioning into the role of being a mother, and reconnecting with one's partner. Moms have a chance to get out of the house, enjoy conversations with one another, share each other's laughter, and sometimes tears.

- 8. I find myself struggling with low energy and feel depressed at times.*
- 9. My anxiety has increased since my baby's birth.*
- 10. I rarely have time to take care of myself, and I have stopped participating in the activities I enjoyed before becoming a mom.*
- 11. Disagreements between my partner and me have increased since we became parents.*
- 12. I find it very difficult to trust others, even my partner, to care for my child.*
