St. James is the Cathedral Church for the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle. It is also a parish church for a large and vital community. Noted for its beautiful liturgies and its extensive outreach to the poor, the Cathedral also serves the city of Seattle as an important gathering place, a crossroads for learning, and a center for the arts.

Built in 1907, St. James Cathedral is an impressive Italian Renaissance-style building whose twin towers soar to a height of 167 feet. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first American citizen to be canonized, worshiped in the Cathedral in its early years. In 1994, a nationally acclaimed restoration and renovation completely renewed the beauty of this beloved Seattle landmark, transforming it into a dynamic space for the celebration of the Church's liturgy as well as for ecumenical, cultural, and civic events.

Artistic highlights of St. James include magnificent ceremonial bronze doors and tabernacle by German artist Ulrich Henn; an award-winning Shrine to the Blessed Virgin Mary; and a large collection of stained glass by renowned artists Charles Connick and Hans Gottfried von Stockhausen. The Cathedral Chapel is home to a remarkable 15th-century Renaissance altarpiece by Neri di Bicci.

St. James Cathedral is also a vibrant parish community of more than 2,400 households, coming from more than 180 ZIP codes around the entire Puget Sound region.



SEDES SAPIENTIAE, SEAT OF WISDOM

At the center of the Archbishop Murphy Courtyard on the south side of the Cathedral is the statue of *Sedes Sapientiae* – Mary, Seat of Wisdom. Mary has many titles – here, she is called “seat” or “throne” of wisdom because she holds Jesus, the Word made flesh, in her arms. For many years, this beloved image of Mary and her Son stood on the grounds of the Archdiocesan Seminary, St. Edward's in Kenmore, on the shores of Lake Washington. Every May, the seminarians would gather in front of this statue at the end of the day to sing a hymn in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To the intercession of Mary, cradling God's own divine Wisdom, they entrusted the hopes and struggles of their day.

After St. Edward's Seminary closed in 1977, the statue was brought to St. James Cathedral. In 2006, the creation of the Archbishop Thomas J. Murphy Courtyard provided a beautiful setting for the well-loved image. Water flows from a hand-hewn source stone on the south side of the Cathedral, and gathers in a pool at Mary's feet. In the evening, the statue is gently illuminated, a reminder that Christ is the light of the world and the living water who alone can quench our thirst.

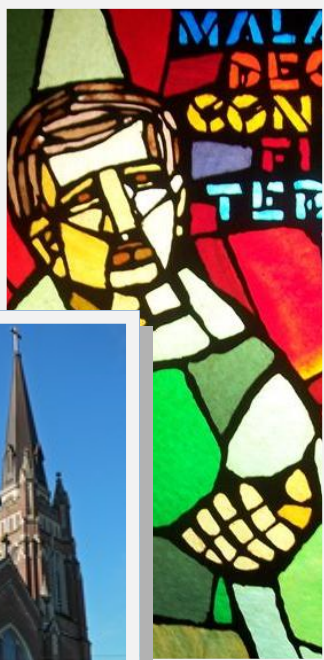
Summer Senior Trip

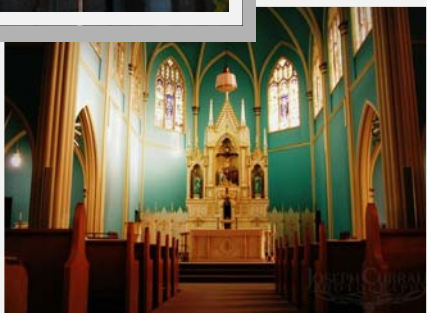


Then we will head to historic **Holy Rosary Parish** in Tacoma for a short tour. We will pray the rosary together before heading back to Seattle.

The four great poems that make up *Four Quartets* are the culminating expression of Eliot's profoundly Christian spiritual vision. This four-week series will be led by **Corinna Laughlin** (Pastoral Assistant for Liturgy and PhD in English Literature). Cathedral reader **Scott Webster** will read each of the poems.
