WELCOME, SUMMER VISITORS!
St. James is glad to welcome visitors from near and far throughout the summer months. Each week this summer, a page in the bulletin will offer some historic and artistic highlights of St. James Cathedral. This week, we highlight the image of Our Lady of Seattle in the Cathedral Chapel.

St. James is the Cathedral Church for the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle. It is also a parish church for a large and vital community. Noted for its beautiful liturgies and its extensive outreach to the poor, the Cathedral also serves the city of Seattle as an important gathering place, a crossroads for learning, and a center for the arts.

Built in 1907, St. James Cathedral is an impressive Italian Renaissance-style building whose twin towers soar to a height of 167 feet. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first American citizen to be canonized, worshiped in the Cathedral in its early years. In 1994, a nationally acclaimed restoration and renovation completely renewed the beauty of this beloved Seattle landmark, transforming it into a dynamic space for the celebration of the Church's liturgy as well as for ecumenical, cultural, and civic events.

Artistic highlights of St. James include magnificent ceremonial bronze doors and tabernacle by German artist Ulrich Henn; an award-winning Shrine to the Blessed Virgin Mary; and a large collection of stained glass by renowned artists Charles Connick and Hans Gottfried von Stockhausen. The Cathedral Chapel is home to a remarkable 15th-century Renaissance altarpiece by Neri di Bicci.

St. James Cathedral is also a vibrant parish community of more than 2,400 households, coming from more than 180 ZIP codes around the entire Puget Sound region.



OUR LADY OF SEATTLE

The Cathedral Chapel is home to two beautiful images of the Blessed Virgin Mary – the Renaissance altarpiece by Neri di Bicci, and a polychromed plaster statue known as “Our Lady of Seattle.” This well-loved image is said to be the first image of Our Lady to be publicly venerated in the city of Seattle. The statue was originally installed at the Church of Our Lady of Good Help in the early 1870s by Msgr. Francis Xavier Prefontaine, Seattle’s pioneer priest. He was the first to encourage Bishop O’Dea to consider moving his episcopal seat from Vancouver to Seattle, as early as 1896. Our Lady of Good Help briefly became the pro-Cathedral when Bishop O’Dea finally did move to Seattle in 1903. After the building of St. James Cathedral in 1907, the parish became a station of the Cathedral, and was staffed by Cathedral priests until 1949, when the old church sustained significant damage in an earthquake and had to be torn down. The statue of Mary has been at St. James ever since.

The brightly-colored image shows Mary standing on a serpent with an apple in its mouth, imagery recalling Genesis 3:9-15. Beneath her feet is a globe, with clouds and stars, suggesting Mary’s queenship over creation. Mary looks down at those who kneel before her, her hands outstretched in a gesture of welcome and of prayer to God.

T. S. Eliot is one of the great poets of the 20th century – the author of *The Waste Land* and *Murder in the Cathedral*, as well as *Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats*, which was later transformed into the musical *Cats*. Eliot himself considered *Four Quartets* (1943) to be his finest work. The four great poems that make up *Four Quartets* are the culminating expression of Eliot's profoundly Christian spiritual vision. This four-week series will be led by **Corinna Laughlin** (Pastoral Assistant for Liturgy and PhD in English Literature). Cathedral reader **Scott Webster** will read each of the poems. All are welcome! It is recommended, but not required, that participants read the designated poem in advance of each session.
