
# PROCLAMATION

## *Historical Notes on Elements of Today's Liturgy*

*In today's Mass of Thanksgiving, Archbishop Brunett carries the Blanchet crosier, which was used by A. M. A. Blanchet, the first Bishop of Nesqually, as the diocese was originally called. This historic crosier has been used at key moments throughout the history of St. James Cathedral. It was carried by Bishop O'Dea at the laying of the cornerstone of the Cathedral on November 12, 1905, and at the Cathedral's dedication on December 22, 1907. It was used at the installation of many of the Bishops and Archbishops of the Archdiocese. It was also used by Archbishop Brunett at the Midnight Mass, 1999, the solemn beginning of our local observance of the Great Jubilee Year 2000.*

*Three crosses are used during today's liturgy. The Great Cross dates from 1950, and the corpus is thought to be the work of a Russian sculptor. The distinctive Metropolitan Cross dates from 1951, when the Diocese of Seattle was elevated to an Archdiocese. And the Festival Cross has been used in processions at the Cathedral from its early years, appearing in photos from the 1920s.*

*The icon of the Apostle James was created especially for St. James Cathedral by Cathedral iconographer Joan Brand-Landkamer. The icon features many local details, including the Cathedral towers and the Seattle skyline.*

*A carved bust of our patron, St. James, features in the entrance procession today. The bust is the work of a German sculptor, and dates from the 15th century. It is the gift to the Cathedral of a generous parishioner. Today, the reliquary bust serves its original purpose: to house a relic of the Apostle James.*
