## *Distribution of Holy Communion*

- + **Communion is given only in the hand.**
- + **Maintain six feet of separation between household groups as you come forward.**
- + **Wear your mask. Hold your hands out as flat as possible so that the minister can easily put the host on your open palm without touching your hand.**
- + **After receiving Holy Communion, lower your mask with one hand, put the host in your mouth, and then put your mask back on.**

**WEEKDAY MASSES OPEN TO THE PUBLIC** Each day from Monday through Saturday, Mass is celebrated at 8:00am in the Cathedral. All are welcome to attend without prior registration. The Mass is also livestreamed at [vimeo.com/archdioceseofseattle](http://vimeo.com/archdioceseofseattle).

**SATURDAY CONFESSIONS** are heard immediately following the 8:00am Mass on Saturday mornings, from 8:30am to 9:30am. During Lent, confessions will also be heard following the 8:00am Mass on Wednesday mornings.

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT** Each Friday in Lent, we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament following the 8:00am Mass, continuing until 1:00pm, with Holy Hour beginning at 12 Noon. All are welcome. (We no longer have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays.)

**THE WAY OF THE CROSS** is a wonderful Lenten tradition in the Church. Stations are prayed on Mondays following 8:00am Mass. In addition, we have prepared a special online version of the Stations led by Father Ryan, with meditations by Paul Claudel and featuring the art of Joan Brand-Landkamer. The Cathedral Stations of the Cross are the work of Joan Brand-Landkamer, inspired by 20th-century French artist Georges Rouault.

**CARE FOR CREATION TIP FOR LENT** To fully live out *Laudato Si'* is to embrace moderation, to know that less truly is more, and to deny yourself in the name of God's creation. About 80% of plastic waste ends up in landfills, left to sit there for decades. Our common home deserves better, and we're called as Catholics and people of faith to do better. During the remainder of Lent, consider fasting from single-use plastics, if possible, avoiding plastics altogether. Pope Francis shared how such a fast can help us create more space for God: "Fasting involves being freed from all that weighs us down – like consumerism or an excess of information, whether true or false – in order to open the doors of our hearts to the One who comes to us, poor in all things, yet 'full of grace and truth' (John 1:14): the Son of God our Savior."

**PARISH REMEMBRANCE** *Throughout the year, because we are the Cathedral Church, we remember in prayer at Mass and Vespers each of the parishes and missions of the Archdiocese of Seattle on a Sunday near their feast day. This week we pray for the parishes of St. Louise in Bellevue and St. Patrick in Seattle and Tacoma.*
