Dear Friends,

It is a joy to welcome you to St. James Cathedral on this Easter of 2022. I do so in the name of our Archbishop, Paul D. Etienne, as well as in my own.

Of all the times we gather as Christian believers, none is more important than Easter — the greatest of all our feasts. Easter celebrates the Mystery that is the very foundation of our Christian faith, for, as St. Paul wrote, “If Christ has not risen, our faith is in vain” (1 Cor. 15:14). How much we, and our world, are in need of Easter peace and hope, and our celebration of Christ risen from the dead offers us just that.

My hope and my prayer is that you will find here at St. James Cathedral something that will comfort you, challenge you, and lift you up. We live in a world that, while incredibly beautiful, is also seriously flawed. Death and life are never very far away from us, are they? But Easter boldly proclaims that death is not the end of the story. Easter proclaims for all to hear that Life will get the last word, not death!

If you are a visitor to the Cathedral, please know that we warmly welcome you and hope that you will return soon — maybe even to become part of this amazing and vibrant community of faith. The doors are open! And if you are already part of the parish family of St. James, I take this opportunity to thank you for all the ways in which you make the Risen Jesus present in this parish and in this city day after day: through your prayer, your faith, and your love that overflow in unselfish service to the poor and in generous advocacy on their behalf.

# Afghanistan: Then and Now



The St. James Cathedral Sponsor Circle Team has welcomed two recently-arrived Afghan families, living out our call to welcome the stranger. Team members have helped with shopping, moving, enrolling in health care, connecting to a local mosque, airport arrivals, interpretation, finding jobs, and more.

More than 70,000 Afghans were evacuated and brought to the U.S. over the past six months. Some of those who have come to the Seattle area have been welcomed by Sponsor Circles like ours, others by refugee resettlement agencies, and others have come on their own. They join an existing local and vibrant Afghan community.

To learn more about how these families came to be here, and the work of the Sponsor Circle, St. James Cathedral's *Immigrant Assistance* and *Racial Solidarity Team* are co-sponsoring an event that will feature a panel discussion on Afghanistan – its history and culture, the current situation in that war-torn country, and a look at the issues facing Afghan refugees as they resettle in our country. 
