Dear Friends,

It is a joy to welcome you to St. James Cathedral on this Easter of 2025. I do so in the name of our Archbishop, Paul D. Etienne, as well as in my own. Of all the times we gather as Christian believers, none is more important than Easter – the greatest of all our feasts. Easter celebrates the Mystery that is the very foundation of our Christian faith, for, as St. Paul wrote, “If Christ has not risen, our faith is in vain” (1 Cor. 15:14). But Christ has risen, and your presence here in the Cathedral today both affirms and celebrates that most amazing and enduring of all realities! While we do not see him, we know he lives, and we know that he is in our midst breathing life and hope into us, walking alongside us on our pilgrimage of faith, our journey toward the Kingdom of God.

I have no way of knowing what is in your heart as you come here on this Easter Sunday. And there is not one of us who is not keenly and painfully aware of the patently unjust war Russia continues to wage on Ukraine, or of the tragic, catastrophic war between Israel and Hamas in the Land we call Holy. And then there is our own nation with all its divisions and injustices. How much we and our world are in need of Easter peace and hope! Our celebration of Christ risen from the dead offers us just that.

My hope and my prayer is that you will find here at St. James Cathedral something to comfort you, challenge you, and lift you up. We live in a world that, while incredibly beautiful, is also seriously flawed. Death and life are never very far away from us, are they? But Easter boldly proclaims that death is not the end of the story. Easter proclaims for all to hear that Life will get the last word, not death!

If you are a visitor to the Cathedral, please know that we warmly welcome you and hope that you will return soon – maybe even to become part of our amazing and vibrant community of faith. The doors are open! And if you are already part of the parish family of St. James, I take this opportunity to thank you for all the ways in which you make the Risen Jesus present in this parish and in this city day after day: through your prayer, your faith, and your love that overflow in unselfish service to the poor and in outspoken advocacy on their behalf.





**ST. JAMES IMMIGRANT ASSISTANCE (SJIA) – PROVIDING FAMILY STABILITY** When a client, who is a lawful permanent resident, becomes a U.S. citizen through naturalization, their minor children who meet specific requirements automatically become U.S. citizens. SJIA helps these children obtain proof of their citizenship from the U.S. Department of State (via a U.S. passport) and the Department of Homeland Security (via a Certificate of Citizenship). These applications can require extensive evidence to prove that the child has met all of the legal requirements to derive citizenship through their naturalized parent. Each family situation is unique, which means the supporting evidence they must submit varies depending on their circumstances. SJIA helps clients navigate this process and collect the strongest, clearest evidence in support of their applications. Knowing their children have evidence of their U.S. citizenship provides much relief to our clients and stability to the entire family. 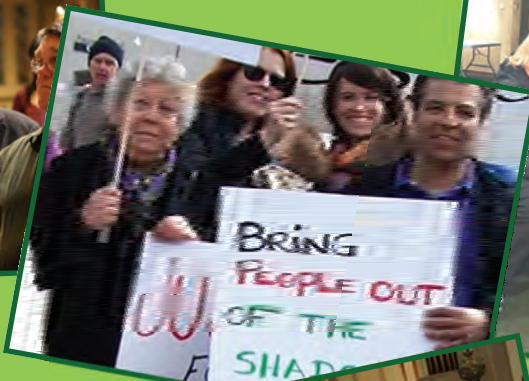
