# From the Pastor's Desk | May 31, 2026

ST. JAMES CATHEDRAL | IMMACULATE CONCEPTION | CHRIST OUR HOPE

Dear Friends,  
As we gather this weekend to celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the Pope's prayer intention for June is timely. It is timely because of what was celebrated in Rome last year on this feast day, and it is timely because of what we look forward to this summer, especially here in Seattle.

Here is the Pope's prayer intention for June: "Let us pray that sports be an instrument of peace, encounter, and dialogue among cultures and nations, and that they promote values such as respect, solidarity, and personal growth." This is a timely intention as we prepare to welcome people from all over the world to our city for the World Cup. In a world so divided, this world-wide sporting event offers a chance to build bridges across cultures and nations.

As athletes and fans gather in our city and fifteen other cities across Canada, the U.S., and Mexico, we have opportunities for promoting peace, encounter, dialogue, respect, and solidarity. Those values can counter the reality in so many places of our world of violence, division, polarization and disregard for human life.

One year ago on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, athletes and fans gathered in Rome for the Jubilee of Sport. This was one of many jubilees that was celebrated throughout the year. In his homily that day, Pope Leo XIV noted that "This combination of Trinity and Sport is somewhat unusual, yet the juxtaposition is not inappropriate. Every good and worthwhile human activity is in some way a reflection of God's infinite beauty, and sport is certainly one of these. For God is not immobile and closed in on himself, but activity, communion, a dynamic relationship between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, which opens up to humanity and to the world. Theologians speak of perichoresis: the life of God is a kind of "dance": a dance of mutual love" (Pope Leo XIV, Homily, June 15, 2025).

Sport is so much a part of our daily lives that it is good to reflect on how it can interact with our faith. Families spend countless hours transporting children and young people to their various sports, watching and encouraging them to compete well, celebrating victories big and small and comforting when losses and defeats come along.

The Pope reflected last year that, "Sport can... help us to encounter the Triune God, because it challenges us to relate to others and with others, not only outwardly but also, and above all, interiorly. Otherwise, sport becomes nothing more than an empty competition of inflated egos."

The Pope went on to reflect on how sport has played an important role in the life of saints. "It is no coincidence that sport has played a significant role in the lives of many saints in our day, both as a personal discipline and as a means of evangelization. We can think of Blessed (now Saint) Pier Giorgio Frassati, the patron saint of athletes... His straightforward and luminous life reminds us that, just as no one is born a champion, no one is born a saint. It is daily training in love that brings us closer to final victory (cf. Rom 5:3-5) and enables us to contribute to the building of a new world."

On this Trinity Sunday, as we continue to enjoy sports in our families, among our friends, and in our city this summer, Pope Leo's words can encourage us to use this time well. He wrote last year, "Dear athletes, the Church entrusts you with a beautiful mission: to reflect in all your activities the love of the Triune God, for your own good and for that of your brothers and sisters. Carry out this mission with enthusiasm: as athletes, as trainers, as associations and groups, and within your families."

May we embrace this beautiful mission.

**ART EXHIBIT NOW IN THE CHAPEL** A special exhibition, *BLIGHT: The Irish Potato Famine of 1845–51*, is hung in the Chapel through June 20. The pieces by Doug Anderson, Professor of Art at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon, tell the story of the Great Famine not only as a humanitarian catastrophe, but as one of the most significant waves of immigration to the United States in the nineteenth century. Through a series of drawings and paintings enriched by historical context and firsthand quotations, *BLIGHT* traces the journey of Irish families who were forced from their homes, crossed the Atlantic under harrowing conditions, and began new lives in America. Today, one in ten Americans claims Irish ancestry, and countless Catholic communities trace their roots directly to Famine-era immigrants. *BLIGHT* seeks to honor the courage, sacrifice, and enduring faith of those who left Ireland and helped build the American Church and nation. 

Attentive to the cries of the Earth and of the poor, we encourage all people to advocate for equitable and sustainable solutions to the climate crisis through prayer, education, and action.



## Did you know?

According to the *Harvard Law School Environmental and Energy Law Program*, the following changes are planned, under review, or have occurred over the past twelve months, 2025-2026. This list is not comprehensive but includes major changes in *pollution protections* that impact human and environmental health across the U.S.

### Climate

- U.S. withdraws from Paris Climate Agreement
- U.S. Dept. of the Interior withdraws from development of offshore wind energy
- EPA rolls back VOC and methane standards for oil and gas production and greenhouse gas reporting requirements

### Habitat

- The Administration begins rollback of regulations and protections for migratory birds
- The Administration takes steps to facilitate commercial deep-sea mining
- EPA removes regulations limiting offshore oil and gas energy development
- Administration proposes rollback of Endangered Species Act

### Water

- EPA works to limit state's ability to regulate activities in water and wetlands
- EPA delays compliance of standards limiting forever chemicals (PFAS) in drinking water

## Act Now for Species Preservation!

Gray whales travel more than 10,000 miles each year between the Arctic and Baja California. Their feeding enriches our oceans, stirring nutrients that sustain entire marine ecosystems. Yet these gentle giants are now dying at alarming rates. At least 21 gray whales have already washed ashore along the Washington Coast this year, with 7 more in San Francisco Bay. Their losses demand urgent attention: stronger protections, reduced vessel impacts, and collective action to safeguard a species essential to ocean health.

Contact your federal legislators (<https://www.congress.gov/contact-us>) to ensure enforcement of the Marine Mammal Protection Act and Endangered Species Act.

The traditional Corpus Christi procession will take place immediately following the 10:00am Mass on Sunday, June 7, with prayer and song. Walking with the Lord, we express our faith in the real presence of Christ in the sacrament of his Body and Blood, and we bring that faith to the streets of our city in joyful witness. The procession concludes on Terry Avenue with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

*"In the sacrament of the Eucharistic bread, the unity of believers, who form one body in Christ, is both expressed and achieved. All are called to this union with Christ, who is the light of the world, from whom we come, through whom we live, and towards whom we direct our lives" (Lumen Gentium, 3). The procession that we are about to undertake is a sign of that journey. Together, as shepherds and flock, we will feed on the Blessed Sacrament, adore him and carry him through the streets. In doing so, we will present him before the eyes, the consciences and the hearts of the people. To the hearts of those who believe, so that they may believe more firmly; to the hearts of those who do not believe, so that they may reflect on the hunger present within them and the bread that alone can satisfy it.*

### **June 12: SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART**

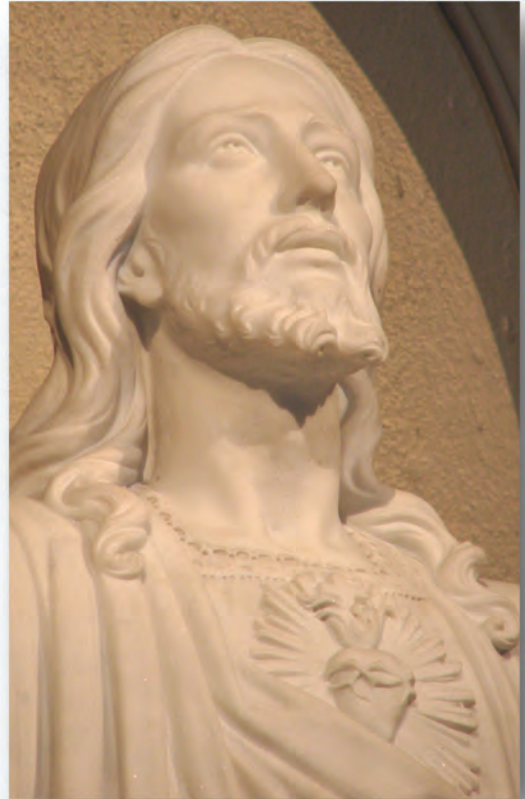
- The day begins with 8:00am Mass celebrated by Father Chanda

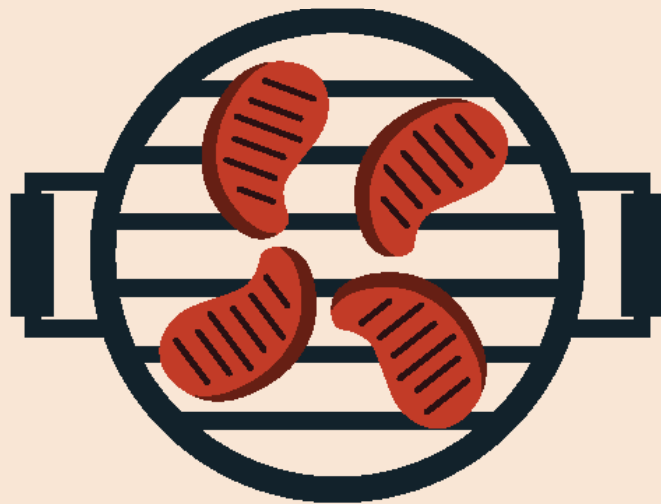
