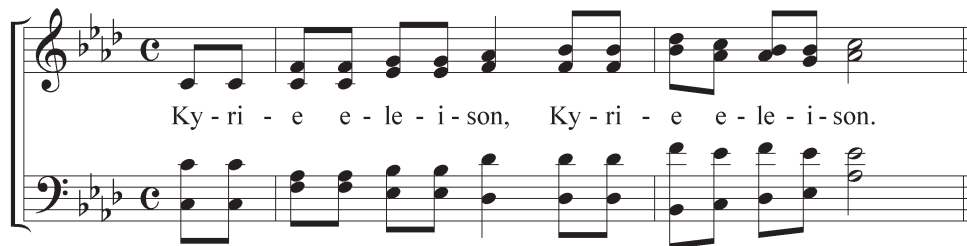
PROFESSION OF FAITH (Apostles' Creed)

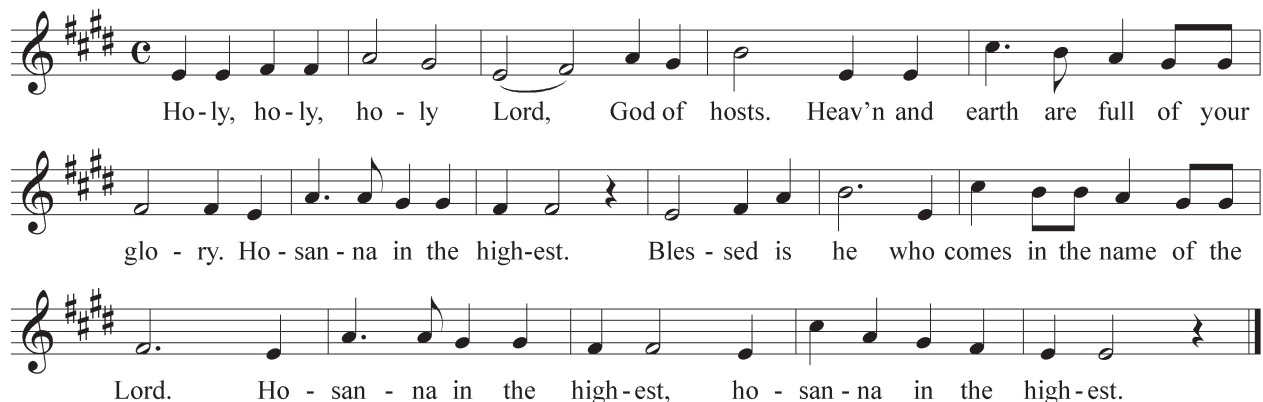
