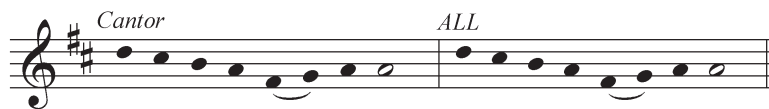

in accordance with the Scriptures.**

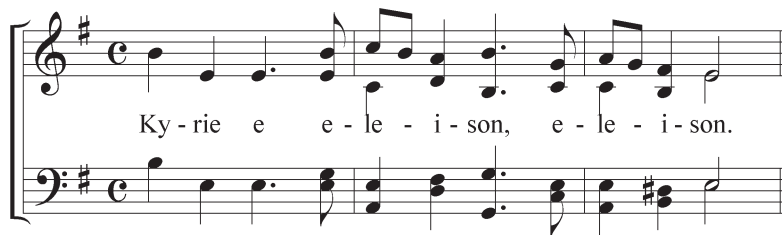
