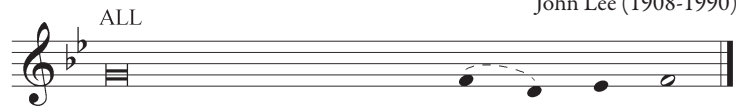

[ALL BOW]


**and by the Holy Spirit


