## About the Notre Dame Glee Club

Founded in 1915, The **Notre Dame Glee Club** draws its membership from all fields of study, and annually presents a broad repertoire in several formal campus concerts as well as in dozens of informal performances at University events. Over the past quarter-century the Glee Club has performed on tour in 45 U.S. states and in 20 countries in Europe, Asia, and Latin America. The 2024-25 season includes concerts in Ontario, Canada and on the U.S. West Coast as well as a tour of Spain's great cathedrals in May and June.

The most recent of several Glee Club recordings is *Christmas at Notre Dame* with the Notre Dame Symphony Orchestra. The Glee Club and Symphony toured their holiday program together in December 2023, performing in distinctive venues in Chicago, Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, and New York. In April the Glee Club will again join with the Symphony for a performance of Symphony no. 13 "Babi Yar" by Dmitri Shostakovich.

**Daniel Stowe** has been a member of the University of Notre Dame faculty since 1993. In addition to directing the Glee Club, he is also conductor of the Notre Dame Symphony Orchestra and the Notre Dame Collegium Musicum, and teaches conducting, music history, and choral literature.
